Dear Phillip,

It's Sunday afternoon. It has been a beautiful day today. Spring has arrived. However, we're a far cry from your 90 degrees with 90% humidity. Sister Scott gave a talk today in sacrament meeting. She has a glow about her and her love for the gospel really shines through. As she spoke I realized that she and Mike have the same smile. Their faces are so similar, yet McKayla's face is softer and prettier. They are a neat family. - As I sat on the stand I looked around counting families and individuals who have moved into the ward since Stanford passed away. My rough count was about 19 that have moved in since that event and about 26 that were here before. So, roughly 1/3 of the ward has moved in since. That means that about that many have moved out too. Strange to think about.

I hope you have enjoyed your sabbath day in Brasil. Hopefully you're able to understand more of the meeting this week than last. It was difficult for me after being in France for only a few weeks. I worried that I'd never get the language down. It just takes time and effort. I found that constantly looking up words in the dictionary helped. Sometimes I'd just read the dictionary looking at words. I'd find a cool word and then notice that it was being used all the time. I had just never noticed. So, use your dictionary. However, I'm sure you'll have the advantage that I never did have, being companions with a native speaker. I'm excited to hear how that goes.

I've been scanning some of Grandma Larsen's pictures again. There is no way I'll even come close to getting done before your Mom goes to Utah in April, but if I can get some of them done then she can take them on the plane back to Grandma. Of all the pictures I scanned I have attached only three. I thought they were interesting. Picture 1 is your Great-Great Grandma Jenny Erickson taken in 1900. She married Soren Nelson and they were the parents of your Great Grandma Judith Nelson Larsen. Picture 2 is Great Grandma Larsen at age 1 taken in 1903. Picture 3 is Great Grandma Larsen in 1988. It is interesting to look at these pictures and think about the people in them. Their time on earth is done. I see pictures of my aunts and uncles when they were young, before they were married, before World War 2. So much promise before them. The future unknown at the time. And now, looking back, the

chapters of their lives are complete.

This made me think of this quote from Elder M. Russell Ballard from Oct 1990 General Conference:

That's two weeks in a row, which is a good sign. That means she is enjoying the group. I need to practice some of our songs. I transposed several of them to Tenor sax and need to work on them so that they play as easily there as on the alto sax.

Sister Stevens has been able to come to sacrament meeting several times. She was there this morning and it was good to see her able to come out.
