Hello, Dear Elder Phillip! I just received your email, and I'm already starting the next one :).

Monday, 21 March, 2011

It is snowing right now! To celebrate spring, we now have snow! I don't think there will be too much, but still, we've had some lovely warming days, and now there is snow again.

On Saturday I went to a meeting for training for ARP (Addiction Recovery Program) for my calling. I was talking after the meeting to Reta and Paul Brown, and mentioned that I was trying to learn a little Portuguese. I said that if I pass people speaking a foreign language, I can recognize German, French, and Spanish. But I can't yet recognize Portuguese. Paul Brown said that to him it sounds like someone is speaking Spanish, but with a sock in his mouth! I wouldn't describe it exactly like that, but I think Spanish is more clipped, more enunciated, and Portuguese is a softer language, the consonants are softer.

I think the challenges you are having with the language are pretty typical, though I know it is frustrating. One thing the Pimsleur language tapes said is that in different areas of Brazil, the language sounds different, in the same way that a person from Maine speaks English very differently from a person from Alabama. I know you'll get better and better with the language with each day.

It sounds like you don't have an actual companion, just yet. And how about Elder Yorgason? Do you both serve with the AP's for now? Are you living with Brazilian Elders, or are some of them American? Elder Wheat sounds like an American name, but maybe not. I can't always tell.

I was talking to Lori, and she told me she found some old pictures. One of them was from 1992, of you and Ricky together, when you boys were about a year old. It was captioned something like, "Future missionaries". And Ricky was holding a ball, and you were holding a Rubik's cube!

I am on lesson 3 of the Pimsleur language tapes. I go over each one over and over. I

talked to Shelli Scott about it, and she said her husband, Mike, did the same thing with Spanish. And she said he learned over and over how to order beer! When Dad was making the tapes into Mp3s, he said that same conversation is on the Portuguese tapes. I guess I'll look up how to say "milk", and substitute that when I'm doing that lesson :).

Wednesday, 23 March 2011

Happy Birthday to Elder Richard Mark Larsen today! And remembering Stanford Mark, who left us 50 months ago today to begin his mission on the other side of the veil. Amazing, how time goes by. Also, Happy Birthday to Elder Adam Hansen, in the Canada Calgary Mission. (His mother posted on FB). A time or two ago when we had missionaries to dinner, I bought a cake from Hannaford and had the bakery write "Happy Birthday Elder Wilder!" on it. That was our dessert, and we gave the rest of the cake to him to bring home. That was three days after his actual birthday, but I figured he would like it if people were celebrating with him. And, since I can't send an actual cake to my own boy when his birthday comes up, or to my nephew or friend, I can make sure our missionaries here are taken care of! I hope the members are taking good care of you and the others missionaries. It sounds like they did in TX, and hopefully they are in Brazil!

Sis. Hansen had a couple of things on FB one day from some people in her sons' missions (some pictures from Chile, posted by the lady of the house where the pictures were taken). I asked her about it, and she said Chris gave her email to people they were working with, so they could friend her on FB. Adam did, too, in Canada. So, if you meet some wonderful people in Brazil you would like to keep up with, you can give them my email so they can friend me. Of course, I'll have to learn Portuguese, I guess :). At least I can try! I can say Bom dia! now! (and I know that means "day", literally, "morning", and that it is a masculine word). I'm working on it!

Thursday, 24 March 2011

Happy Birthday to your Dad! I'm going to meet him and Heather today for lunch. Then we'll have the dinner, cake, and candle race on Sunday. This is the time of year when there are lots of birthdays in our house!

Amy Phillips posted the other day that she is expecting baby #6 in May. I wonder if she knows its gender, and what they will name the baby to go along with the other names?

Monday, 28 March 2011

I've liked this, writing a bit as I think of it. It helps me to remember to write things to you! On Saturday Julia and I (and Dad, too, for LOTS of help with equipment) went to the Young Woman's Broadcast, with a dinner and wonderful program before. I was sitting next to Kendall Hood, and she asked, "So how is Elder Larsen?" I told her of

some of the things in your last email, about struggling with the language, and some of the other things. She said it was bringing back lots of memories of her own mission to Lima, Peru. She said she had those feelings, exactly! She remembers the frustration, and thinking she would NEVER learn the language. But, she did! And she was remembering funny things, too, like being in the jungle, teaching a family. The little kids had never seen panty hose before, and while the missionaries were trying to teach this spiritual lesson, the kids were picking at their pantyhose, playing with them!
