Hello Dear Phillip,

You received a Facebook friend request for Luciana Carvalho N Ferreira. What do you want to do with that one?

Attached are some pictures. Someone took a picture of Winston being his normal lazy self. They had Toga day for Julia's latin class. I finally decided what to use my personal money for. For months I've been debating between a large screen TV, a new digital camera, or a new tenor saxophone. I finally decided to buy myself a new tenor saxophone, hence the 4th picture. The money I used came from the finders bonus I got for getting Dave Huntington a job at TCC and also Heather. I have a little left that I'll use to buy another mouth piece in a while. I want to get used to the horn first and then I'll be in a better position to choose another mouthpiece.

Did you know that Joyce was an animagus? Attached are two pictures taken at dinner time on Sunday. Proof positive!

I bought the saxophone this past Saturday, May 21st, at the high school. They were having a "Music and Arts Regional Instrument Event." Mr Courrounis had told me a couple months ago that this was coming up, so I planned to attend and buy a horn. I tried out 5 different horns and settled on this one.

Saturday and Sunday were our Stake Conference. It was a satellite broadcast conference like the one you attended in the TLM. I was finally able to start singing and it was an awesome experience to sing that for stake conference. I could tell that many people were touched by the spirit as we sang.

I've decided to follow your Mom's example. For quite a while now she has been taking notes at all meetings in a notebook that she brings. I've taken notes on occasion on "brain cells", but that isn't very lasting. I told her that I wanted to start taking notes so she gave me a journal like the ones you have. Today I started that journal by taking notes during stake conference. I'll just keep it with my hymn book that I use for organ playing.

It looks like I'll be travelling to Egypt in the near future for work. TCC's new optical encryptor, the DSD72B-SP, that I've been working on for almost 3 years is in the final stages of development. It isn't fully ready, there are still bugs to work out, but Carl has stated that it needs to be ready to ship to Egypt for a demo. Carl is going to Egypt this week and will find out when they want a demo system to try out. Once the demo system ships, I'll be going a week later to set it all up and demonstrate.

You wondered about how to include Bradford more. I don't think he felt left out of the telephone call. He spent some of the time during the call downstairs doing laundry, but he could hear everything because I was recording it on the computer in the basement and the volume was up. I don't think he had much to say in a public

conversation like that. Bradford is still connected to the family and there is love there. Keep praying for him just like Joyce and I do, that his heart will soften and that he will come back.

Concerning relationships with friends. Those are forced to evolve as situations change. When you're the one "left behind" then it is harder in some ways. The people that move are having the new experiences. We just continue on with life the way it was, except that our friends are gone. Once someone graduates from high school everything changes. Everyone moves on to other schools and activities. It is a rare thing to have a lasting relationship with anyone from high school. So, for now, the best you can do is to be the best missionary that you can. Be a friend to those you teach. Share these experiences in your emails home. Things will work out. Heavenly Father is in charge.

I finished mp3s of the D&C and April General Conference for the 3rd time this past week. I've started in on Conference again and this time I'm alternating with the Pearl of Great Price. It's been a while since I listened to the PofGP. There is amazing stuff in that book. I'm really enjoying it.


