NEW STUFF:

Well... let's see. What happened here this past week? Hmmm.... Well, Emmy went back to NM on Tuesday, Aug 16th. That was also Rachel's 2 year anniversary of baptism. Funny thing about Emmy... When we made all the airplane plans back in June, Maryann said that Emmy should return home on the 16th. The paper calendar that she had sent to us before that showed that being the 1st day of school. When we were in NM we asked about it and Maryann said that the school had changed the start day. Well, it turns out that that was incorrect and the 16th really was the 1st day of school for Emmy. So, she missed her first day! That would be guite the rude

awakening, get home late from NH and then start school the next morning! Emmy made the trip flying solo just fine. We prayed for safety and protection for her and Heavenly Father answered our prayers.

Thursday I had my annual physical. It was exactly 1 year to the day from my last physical. The past two or three years my blood work has shown that I'm anaemic. Last year at the Stanford Memorial Blood Drive I was unable to donate blood because my number was too low. That was disappointing. In January this year I started taking iron supplement for 60 days. I was hoping that would make a difference and it turns out that it did. My levels are still a little low, but well within the normal range. So, I'll start donating blood again, and the first time will be this Friday, Aug 16th, which is the annual Stanford Memorial Blood Drive. Everything else about my physical checked out fine as well. So, based on that I will be around for a few years yet. Doctor Thyng did mention that I've put on a few pounds since last year. After New Mexico trip I was tipping the scales at about 201 lbs. I don't like that! So, I've been cutting back on the empty calorie stuff and have been trying to eat smaller portions. I've lost about 3 pounds in a month, but I'd still like to get down to around 195. I was only about 155 lbs when Joyce and I got married.

Ward temple night was supposed to be on Friday, but that is also when the Bentalls scheduled Daniel's Eagle Court of Honor. That is a once in a lifetime event, so we chose to go to that instead of the temple. The CofH was very nice. The Bentalls are a cool family. They are shining examples of gospel living.

Saturday morning we went to the temple for a 9:00 AM session. The Heritage Park YSA Ward was having their temple day at that time, so we went with Heather and took Jonathan with us. After the endowment session one of the matrons, Sister Chapolas, nabbed us to spend some time doing sealings. The four of us went in and had a very enjoyable time with Brother Hutchinson who was the sealer at that time. He used to be temple president about the time when Stanford was ill. Joyce and I were proxies for about ten or fifteen couple sealings. After that Jonathan was the proxy for sons to parent sealings and Heather was proxy for daughters. That was the first time for both of them to be proxies. I'm glad we stayed longer and did that. Saturday was a good day.

Sunday was a nice day at our meetings. I really enjoy being in our ward. Joyce went to Littleton after Sunday School making one of her RS President trips. Right after the meeting block went came home. The plan was that Jonathan would then go to Heritage Park Sacrament Meeting. As we pulled into our driveway my cell phone vibrated. It was Heather calling from the on ramp to exit 1 by her apartment. She had a flat tire. So, I quickly changed clothes, grabbed my hydraulic jack from the shed, and Jonathan and I went to exit 1. Upon arriving Heather and Jonathan got in the Toyota and drove to their meetings. Heather was supposed to play for sacrament

meeting and ended up getting there just before the meeting started. I stayed behind and worked on the car. It turns out that the flat right rear wheel was already missing a lug nut. Then another lug nut sheared off while trying to remove it. That left only 2 lug nuts on that wheel. I thought I'd take one off the front wheel and put it on the rear so that there would be 3 on each tire. Well, when I tried to remove the lug nut it also sheared off! So, I didn't try to take off anymore. It turns out that I was unable to use bolts on either side of the wheel and the lug nuts were side by side. That made the wheel wobble while driving. I slowly made my way home. We'll take the car to Hansons tonight and leave it on the lot. Fortunately no one was hurt and no damage occurred.

I've been practicing a lot on my saxophones. It is fun to work diligently at getting better at that. It takes lots of practice to get good at something, whether that be missionary work, profession, music, sports, art, gospel knowledge... Everything takes time and effort. That's part of the test of mortality. We only have 24 hours a day. How we spend our time determines who we become. Brother Rigg used this scripture in his sacrament meeting talk today: D&C 121:34&35: "Behold, there are many acalled, but few are chosen. And why are they not chosen? Because their ahearts are set so much upon the things of this ^bworld, and ^caspire to the ^dhonors of men, ..." In High Priest Group lesson today Brother Silvestro quoted a friend who said, "What you feed grows and what you starve dies." It was from the point of view of how to overcome bad habits or lifestyles. If you put your efforts and thoughts into worthwhile things they will grow. In doing that you starve the bad things or habits and their influence decreases in your life. It is an interesting thought.

Well dear son, that is it for this week. I look forward to your emails every week and love reading them. It is very satisfying as a parent to witness the progress of a child. You're doing a great work. I'm proud of you.
