Hello Dear Phillip,

Another week has zipped by. Monday was Patriots Day as I mentioned last week. It was nice to have a day off and get some things done. We raked that day and filled up all 11 garbage cans with leaves and yard waste. The "garbage boys" picked that all up Friday so Saturday I filled up 6 of the cans again. I finally raked all around behind the shed and then a bunch of the leaves in the area of the "woods" bordering the back yard "grass". I got tired of raking after a few hours so I quit. Also on Saturday I disassembled the AC compressor that is behind the house. I never have covered it up in the autumn and over time some leaves have made there way into its interior. About 3 inches of leaves had accumulated in the bottom and it was bugging me. So, I figured out how to take the top off and balance the fan assembly with one hand while using the other hand to vacuum everything out. Now it's clean. I also tested the AC and proved it is still working. This fall I'll put a tarp or board on top of it so the leaves can't get in.

We had the missionaries over for dinner Saturday evening as you can see from the attached pictures. Elder Stephens was replaced by Elder Piacitelli. He has about as

Bradford was over on Saturday doing laundry, eating with us, and then Amy came over later in the evening to play games with Bradford, Heather, and Julia. They were having a fun time. I didn't play any games this time. I took a few underexposed pictures of them playing games.

I've been consumed the last few weeks trying to figure out how to manipulate video files. I've mentioned that project in previous emails. I finally figured out a method that works, but it took me many days to get there. I tried so many different approaches. So many of them seemed hopeful at first and then ended up not working. I've been spending so much time trying to figure it out that I ended up skipping the gym two days last week. I'd wake up and my mind would immediately start thinking about the next thing to try. I'd tell myself that I'd go downstairs just for a guick look, and then it would end up being a couple of hours and I'd miss the gym. Saturday morning I started in almost first thing. That's the day that I finally found a video editor that actually worked! It does exactly what I was looking for and more. I'm able to import video clips into a project and easily edit them and combine them. Then I'm able to render the whole project into a wide variety of output formats. Being able to do it on my Linux box with its quad core processor and 8 GB of RAM makes the processing much faster. So, the only thing I need to do on the old awesome-beast is the video capture from the Beta tapes. All the rest of it can be done on the Linux box. I've even figured out how to render the video so that it plays on my Kindle Fire tablet.

I'm plowing through all of Mandy's Beta tapes now. There are several tapes with Christmas shows on them. Some of them are familiar like "How the Grinch Stole Christmas" and "Charlie Brown Christmas", but there are a bunch of them that I don't ever remember seeing before. Many are along the line of "Rudolf the Red Nose Reindeer", the claymation kinds of shows. I'm able to record them onto the computer and load the file into the video editor and cut out all the ads.

There was no band rehearsal this past Tuesday and there won't be one this Tuesday either because it is vacation week. Since there was no band I was able to attend the recognition program at NHSS for students who achieved straight A grades the previous semester. For Julia this is actually three semesters in a row and it is looking good to make it four in a row.

That means I won't be able to practice the sax at all in the morning. I'm thinking I might try to get to work earlier so that I can leave earlier. That would give me some time in the evening to practice.

This Wednesday is our ward's youth temple trip. I'll be going directly to the temple from work. It is always nice to be with the youth in the temple.
