We are having another quilt-a-thon in our ward a week from Sat. Last Mon. I went down to Freddie Copier's to look over the quilt kits our R.S. Pres. had picked up and what an unpleasant surprise. Many of them were still just quilt blocks about 12 inches square waiting to be sewed. Then those that were sewed together were very poorly done. That isn't too surprising, however, as they had been done by people who work there (at the D.I.) and are in training.
